Reclaiming My Masculinity

For everyone who deals with same sex attractions, whether they are unwanted or not, it is a reality that the devil has stolen a part of our lives from us that Father never intended for us to have lacking. That part is a healthy gender identity.

Father created me a male. I was born a male. I look like a male. But somewhere along my developmental years as a youngster, I never quite caught on to the whole masculine thing. I sure didn't fit the stereotype. I wasn't interested in, or good at, sports; I was not your average rough and tumble boy. I was more interested in singing, acting and the performing arts. But most importantly, I never developed that sense of belonging to the male gender. I never felt like I fit in. When I would try doing "guy" things, I was so bad at them that I would be ridiculed by my peers for performing so poorly. So, the rejection I felt from other males caused me to want to withdraw, which kept me from bonding with them, which kept my homo-emotional (legitimate same sex) needs from being met. I needed to feel accepted, I needed to be included, and I needed to know a sense of belonging to the same kinds of things that other boys realized. But it just wasn't there for me.

By the time puberty initiated its invasion (and overtook me), my messed up gender identity allowed me to begin sexualizing those longings and desires to fit in and be a part of the whole masculine identity, and I found myself sexually attracted to other males. It also didn't help that I was molested at thirteen, and was ridiculed for my lack of "maleness" by a set of neighborhood parents as well. Meanwhile, I had always carried this inner sense that I was supposed to grow up to be a husband and father, making my adolescence quite the confusing time. My dating in high school may have been partly me attempting to fulfill that inner sense, but also it may have been me trying to prove to myself, and anyone else who may have been wondering, that I really was a guy—that my existence as a male was not an "oops" moment for God.

There has been so much controversy in recent years over what causes a homosexual orientation in a male. There has been a big push by the gay community, Hollywood, and the liberal media to make us believe that having same sex attractions is the result of "the gay gene," the "fact" that we are born this way. In reality though, it is

not a fact. There has never been a confirmed genetic link to homosexuality, but the fallacy continues to be perpetuated. I believe what I have described above, the failure to bond in healthy relationships with members of the same sex, is the major contributing factor that caused my homosexual attractions.

My belief is that the thing that caused my same sex attractions is the key to experiencing what would correct them.

I had never immersed myself into the gay culture or took on a gay identity, and I was striving to live out my commitment to the Lord as much as I knew how given my situation. I certainly never thought or believed for a moment that my homosexual encounters were OK. Then, seventeen years ago, under the conviction of the Holy Spirit, I turned my back on the sin I'd given myself to for nearly 30 years. During that time, Father was orchestrating my life in such a way that I began developing healthy relationships with men who would come to model godly masculinity to me. Prior to this I was fearful and felt intimidated at the thought of letting healthy and godly heterosexual males into my world. I was so insecure in my masculinity and myself. Would they reject me too if they knew the real me, I thought? But as Father worked His own plan in me as I pursued my relationship with Him, and with the help of these healthy men He put into my life over the years (and later realizing there were even some He had sent me while I was still in my sin), I began to see my male gender identity become more solidified. My self-perception began to shift to a more satisfying masculine point of view as I learned to become the man Father created me to be. Believe it or not, I slowly became more interested in sports. As I became more secure in myself as a man, I found I was no longer intimidated by the idea of participating in a volleyball, softball, or touch football game.

Men who struggle with unwanted same-sex attractions also need to be able to relate to other men facing like challenges for encouragement and support, because of their common personal experiences and feelings. Both types of relationships, those who struggle with their sexual identity and those who are what we call "ever-straights," are essential, I believe, for my coming into the full purposes of God for my life. I was at a church meeting the other night, and the thought occurred to me, as I was in a conversation with two other men, that I was no longer intimidated in this type of situation. I no longer feel lonely/alone/isolated/inferior/out-of-place as I used to in a group of men. Father has been seeing that my legitimate same-sex needs are being met these days, as they had not been previously in life. Father is restoring what the enemy had stolen from me.

My part has been to reclaim my masculinity, take back again my maleness that Father chose for me in the beginning. There have been many components to this process, the most important being my choice to pursue godliness, holiness and purity as Jesus demonstrated beyond anything else in life. There has been much prayer, healing,

deliverance, and commitment to making righteous daily, even moment-by-moment, choices that will align my life with my Father's kind intentions towards me.

In my Father's good humor, He blessed me, a man who had a seriously messed-up sexual identity, with three sons to teach how to be men. All of it has been a challenging, yet rewarding journey, for which I am truly grateful. No one would ever choose these life-challenges beforehand, but Father continues to be faithful to light the path He's laid out for me. Abba's Delight is one of the highlights of this journey. What a trip I'm on!!! For those of you who are strugglers and/or overcomers of same-sex attractions, and for those of you who have friends, family members or loved ones either who struggle or are entrenched in the gay lifestyle, there is a book I just finished reading that I picked up at the Exodus Conference in June that I want to strongly recommend to you. I know, it's two months since the conference concluded, but if you know anything at all about my reading habits, you should know that for me to finish a book in only two months, that's like warp speed. Anyway, the book is by Jeff Konrad and it's called "You Don't Have To Be Gay." It is one of the clearest descriptions of why someone takes on a gay identity, and how to leave the lifestyle. Mr. Konrad writes it in letterform to a younger brother in Christ, Mike, who is battling his own sexual identity issues.
