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THIS MONTH'S MEDITATION SCRIPTURE: Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love. 1 John 4:7,8

Love, And Some Thoughts About It

God is love. Love is from God. So say our meditation Scripture verses this month seen above. Later in this same chapter, John tells us that we love because He first loved us (1 Jn 4:19). Elsewhere in the Scriptures, we know that Jesus is God (Jn 10:30); that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life, and that no one comes to the Father but by Him (Jn 14:6); that God the Father gave His Son Jesus as the blood sacrifice for the sins of the whole world (Is 53:4-6); that no one has greater love than the one who lays down his life for his friends (Jn 15:13); that we are Jesus' friends if be obey His commands (Jn 15:14); that we will keep His word if we love Him, and that those who do not love Him do not keep His words (Jn 14:23,24).

These passages tell us many things. Because God is love, He is the only One who can define what true love is. Therefore, is any expression truly love that the world (or even the Church) calls love, if it is outside the scope of God's word and expression?

Not only does He tell us of His love, but He also shows us His love. He showed His love for mankind by sending Jesus to earth to take on the sins of the whole world so that we could live in Him on the earth and throughout eternity with Him in heaven. His actions are true to His word. And He continues to demonstrate His love for us each and every day of our lives.

The apostle Paul provides love's characteristics in his first letter to the Corinthian church. He says that love is patient, kind, not jealous, not boastful, not arrogant, not unbecoming, and not self-seeking, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered, does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth. He adds that love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things, and that love never fails (13:4-8a). What a yardstick by which to measure our lives!

When Jesus was asked what the greatest commandment is, He responded that we must love God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our mind, and love our neighbors as ourselves (Mt 22:36-40). God's love cannot be expressed in isolation, but rather in the context of relationship and community. Close, not from afar. Several decades ago, I heard love defined by a Bible teacher (paraphrasing here) as choosing another's highest good in all situations above our own desires. That is what God has done for us.

Our motivation in expressing love to God and to one another is not to secure a bigger mansion in heaven for ourselves. Rather, our motivation should be to follow the Holy Spirit's leading as we are about the work of establishing Jesus' kingdom here on earth. It is for His sake, and the sake of His kingdom, not for our own sakes. We pray that His kingdom come to earth and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Our obedience to the Spirit's leading is our expression of love to our Father.

As we commemorate the passion of Jesus in His scourging and His death on the cross, and as we celebrate His resurrection from the dead conquering sin and death, let us do so with a renewed commitment to love and serve Him as ambassadors of His kingdom, for His sake and for His purposes, as His glory fills the earth.
