Those Pushing Gender Boundaries Need Father's Love, Too

I always look forward to the Olympics. Thank God for DVRs! Of the winter sports, I especially enjoy Figure Skating; I always have. My kids grew up hearing terms like "short programs," "triple axles," "degree of difficulty," and others. Familiar names were Scott Hamilton, Kristi Yamaguchi, Brian Boitano, and Tonya Harding. I love the athleticism, the strength, the self- discipline, much of the music, and even many of the costumes. I continue to be a fan.

I have, though, been very disappointed in seeing those skaters who are openly LGBT celebrated and encouraged in their prideful displays. And in more recent years, one who has retired from skating has become a network commentator. His choices of on-air feminized outfits seem to become more flamboyant as time goes on. I don't see these kinds of displays with any other country's representatives. And I do not believe it is a distinction that is in the best interests of the United States, especially from a spiritual perspective. Psalm 33:12a says, "Blessed are the people whose God is the Lord..." We can no longer say that righteously about the United States, in my opinion.

Be that as it may, I/we have a choice. I can condemn, ridicule, or belittle those men I've described, or I can pray for them. Their LGBT identity should not be a deterrent from being introduced to Father's love. Just as anyone else, it is not Father's will for them to perish without having the opportunity to inherit eternal life. We Christians tend to do well at providing the **truth**, but not so great at combining equal amounts of **grace**. We want to beat them over the head with Scripture and doctrine, but we don't want to take the time to invest in their lives with love and mercy. In John 1:14, Jesus is described as coming from the Father, full of grace and truth. Jesus was both. He wasn't one or the other. He wasn't one, then the other. He is full of grace and truth together all at the same time. The aspects of His grace cannot be separated from His love. And His love cannot be she abroad without His grace. We are to be the same.

The best definition I've seen for the New Testament Greek word used most often for grace is: the divine influence upon the heart, and its reflection in the life. In other words, God's power in us to do His will, His Spirit moving upon us to represent Jesus to those we engage.

I'm not suggesting a Kumbaya-fest with everyone standing in a circle holding hands, trying to manufacture empathetic platitudes. That is a weak, humanistic counterfeit. As Christbearers, we need to demonstrate a true reflection of Father's love: strong, powerful, able to change lives, yet humble, compassionate and merciful as well. Full of grace and truth! This is what can bring redemptive change into anyone who is in need of the Savior, not only those in the LGBT community. It is only when they are apprehended by Jesus that there will be cause to celebrate.

We believers certainly have our work cut out for us!
