

THIS MONTH'S MEDITATION SCRIPTURE: I now rejoice, not that you were made sorrowful, but that you were made sorrowful to the point of repentance; for you were made sorrowful according to the will of God, in order that you might not suffer loss in anything through is. For the sorrow that is according to the will of God produces a repentance without regret, leading to salvation; but the sorrow of the world produces death. 2 Cor. 7:9,10

# Repentance: Way of Life, Not an Event

The Lord has been speaking to me recently about repentance. I participate in a couple of prayer gatherings that meet monthly, and in one of them particularly repentance is a recurring theme. Do we even need to repent as Jesus' disciples? A quick review of the Scripture references to repentance in my concordance shows that repentance is not only essential for the new believer coming to Christ as he/she turns from a life of sin, but that it is also a vital component in the lives of His followers.

As we are working out our salvation with fear and trembling towards faithful obedience, as Paul explains in Philippians 2:12, repentance from ongoing sins we commit remains necessary in our maturing process, as we prove ourselves "to be blameless and innocent children of God above reproach..." v15

In my own life, there have been times when I have resisted repentance as a believer, being prideful and arrogant in my thinking that I was above having difficulties in certain areas of my life that were "not so bad."

Many churches have adopted policies of not talking about sin from the pulpit in deference to feel-good messages that promote believers' high self-esteem, but in reality fall short of the truth of God's view towards our sin. This practice can leave the Christian believing that Father never disapproves, never is angered, and never will allow negative consequences of our choices. Public repentance has all but become a thing of the past. We have healing services, miracle services, revival services, etc., but when was the last time you saw or attended

a meeting specifically held for personal or corporate repentance by a congregation? In Revelation, God called four of the seven churches to repentance because of various sins going on within them.

Probably the most-quoted verse about repentance in recent history here in America, one that I hear quite frequently, is 2 Chronicles 7:14, which states, "...and My people who are called by My name humble themselves and pray, and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin, and will heal their land..." Often, when I have heard this verse cited, the context has been in a Christian gathering, but spoken about our country and its sins, which I believe is a misunderstanding of the verse. God has not said if our country humbles itself, prays, seeks His face, and turns from its wicked ways, then He will fulfill those promises. He said, "...and My people who are called by My name..." We Christians, we followers of Jesus, those of us in the church pews must be the ones to repent of our wickedness if we expect that healing to take place. It is the Church that must set the example for the world, so that they can see and turn. I think we've gotten this wrong, and we must repent. At the end of that chapter in verses 21,22, we read, "... As for this house, which was exalted, everyone who passes by it will be astonished, and say, 'Why has the Lord done thus to this land and to this house?' And they will say, 'Because they forsook the Lord, the God of their fathers, who brought them from the land of Egypt, and they adopted other gods and worshipped them and served them, therefore He has brought all this adversity on them."

So, we have a mandate from our Father towards personal as well as corporate repentance. How will we respond? How will you respond? Father, awaken us to Your call to repentance, and may we be found faithful in our obedience?
