THIS MONTH'S MEDITATION SCRIPTURE: *For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age, looking for the blessed hope and the appearance of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus; who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds. Titus 2:11-14*

[Permission to Say "NO!"](#)

In 12-step addiction recovery programs, Step 1 calls for the addict to recognize and accept that he/she is powerless over their addiction. For some, this is easy; for others, it is quite difficult. The addict often makes this step more complicated than it needs to be. For the Christian, as we see in this month's meditation Scripture passage, God's grace teaches us that in our salvation experience and process we must "deny ungodliness and worldly desires..." In other words, we are to give no place to them in our call to righteous living. We struggle with our desires, we fight against temptation, but often end up giving in when we feel the battle becomes too fierce, choosing to end the skirmish (temporarily) by indulging our sin. Then, of course, after we give in to the sin, we often find ourselves clumsily navigating through the cycle of shame for having fallen...again.

For many of us, in our minds we believe that it's a foregone conclusion that we'll end up giving in when the temptation to sin enters our minds, so we may as well just not fight and go ahead and repeat the lust-temptation-sin-shame process, getting it over with until the next time we're attacked. But in all of this disorder, we forget one very important truth.

We must **give ourselves permission to say "no"** to temptation. We know that we are instructed to avoid sin as our passage above tells us, but we also need to learn to speak to our souls as David did in the Psalms and **give ourselves permission** to deny ungodliness and our worldly desires. I have seen this intent become a revelation for strugglers who felt their only alternative was eventually to give in to their sin each time the inclination struck, but we don't have to live there.

In James 4:7, we are told, "Submit therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you." I've heard this verse misquoted and mishandled many times when people have said they resisted the devil, but he didn't flee, and then wonder why they don't have victory. First, we must be submitted to God, then when we resist, the enemy will flee. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 6:18 to flee sexual immorality. Fleeing sexual immorality reminds me of the story of Joseph when he fled from Potiphar's wife who pursued him to have sex with her. He did not want to offend God, or her husband who was his boss. She lied about Joseph to Potiphar and Joseph ended up in prison. He chose correctly, even to his own hurt. And God used it to advance Joseph toward His own purposes for His people Israel.

We have the command to say no from Paul, we have the process from James by which we can avoid giving in to temptation to sin. We must act on the Scriptures by giving ourselves permission to say no to those temptations to help us remain in holiness and in right standing with God our Father. Each time you have a choice, give yourself permission to say "NO!" and stand your ground.
