

October 11, 2018: National Coming Out Day

Earlier this month, the LGBTQ community celebrated National Coming Out Day. According to Wikipedia, "National Coming Out Day (NCOD) is an annual LGBT awareness day observed on October 11 and 12 in some parts of the world. Founded in the United States in 1988, the initial idea was grounded in the feminist and gay liberation spirit of the personal being political, and the emphasis on the most basic form of activism being coming out to family, friends and colleagues, and living life as an openly lesbian or gay person. The foundational belief is that homophobia thrives in an atmosphere of silence and ignorance, and that once people know that they have loved ones who are lesbian or gay, they are far less likely to maintain homophobic or oppressive views...NCOD was founded in 1988 by Robert Eichberg and Jean O'Leary. Eichberg, who died in 1995 of complications from AIDS, was a psychologist from New Mexico and founder of the personal growth workshop, The Experience. O'Leary was an openly lesbian political leader and long-time activist from New York, and was at the time the head of the National Gay Rights Advocates in Los Angeles. LGBT activists, including Eichberg and O'Leary, did not want to respond defensively to anti-LGBT action because they believed it would be predictable. This caused them to found NCOD in order to maintain positivity and celebrate coming out. The date of October 11 was chosen because it is the anniversary of the 1987 National March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights."

In 2017, I wrote the following FaceBook post on October 11th, and want to share it in our Abba's Delight newsletter this month, with just a few updates:

While others are celebrating the coming out into their gay life, I am celebrating almost 26 years since I left my secret life in homosexuality.

It had me in hopeless bondage to sexual expressions not approved or blessed by God, along with unhealthy emotional attachments to behaviors which contributed to emotional immaturity in my life. Already a born-again disciple of Jesus, I struggled for nearly 30 years with the inner conflict between knowing God's created design for sexual expression and my same-sex attractions that over those 26 years have significantly lessened, but have never left completely. I am no longer driven as I was in the past to hook up with men. Also, I struggled with the inner conflict of knowing the Biblical standard yet feeling helpless to consistently meet it.

I, along with thousands of others who have left the gay life and LGBTQ expressions, have found God's Word to be true when the apostle Paul wrote to the Church in Corinth, a church filled with followers of Christ who were also facing their own sexual issues as believers, "Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor homosexuals, nor thieves, nor the covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers, will inherit the kingdom of God." But the next verse holds God's great promise to us! "Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God." 6:9-11

I celebrate this freedom to live in holiness before the Lord, as God has said, "Be holy, for I am holy." This freedom was provided by Jesus' death and resurrection, forgiving all my sins from which I repent constantly. I continue to wage the war of the flesh against the spirit, and I am strengthened daily by the power of the Holy Spirit within me. There will always be some form of temptation this side of eternity, whether sexual or otherwise, yet I have the choice each and every time to choose life and peace or sin and death.

In 2004, a full-page ad appeared in the LA Times that said, "I questioned homosexuality, and when I found a way out, I took it." I echo that declaration today, and I am eternally grateful God showed me the way out.

From a sister in Christ: HI Daniel, I really liked the way that the person at the end, put their comments of their identity in Christ. Thanks for putting that in there. She put it so well. I do agree with her. Anyone that has an identity other than in Christ, is like someone who is playing a game of tug of war. Only one will gain ultimate traction.
