Trusting God Means Taking a Risk

According to StillFaith.com, there are over 150 Bible verses about trusting God. I don't recall any of them where God says the words, "I command you to trust Me." He just says it matter-of-factly. But it is an instruction to us, His sons and daughters, so that we might live the abundant life He has chosen for us.

But if you're anything like me, trusting doesn't come easy, because it means that I have to give up some of my control of something to someone other than myself. If I am trusting only myself, I can take credit when things go well; and if things don't go well, I can take full responsibility. But the fact is, I'm not always trustworthy. I don't always make the best decisions. But there is One who is always trustworthy, and because He is all-knowing with all wisdom, He does make the best decisions.

When we are children, we instinctively trust our parents and care-givers because we are incapable of caring for ourselves. As we get older, though, our trust in those others can be broken. Promises not kept, feeling we were let down, suffering some kind of violation by physical, emotion, verbal or sexual abuse, can cause our trust to be breached and once that happens it is very difficult to ever trust them again. Rebuilding trust has to be worked from both sides, and may take a good deal of time to accomplish. The one who broke the trust must work to prove himself/herself trustworthy again, while the one whose trust was broken must take the risk of being hurt again in a repeated violation, or multiple ones.

God isn't like we are. He is completely trustworthy, and with Him there is no risk. For us, though, if our trust has been violated by those we know and love, it makes it harder to trust God. Having had our trust violated makes us want to remain in control of our lives. But if we're ever going to have an intimate relationship with our heavenly Father, we must surrender control of our own lives and the live fors whom we give care, and learn to allow Him to move us and guide us as He pleases; especially if we are going to be effective for His kingdom on earth. Twelve years ago, I wrote, "Our trust in God is daily, sometimes hour-by-hour, and even moment-by-moment. If our lives are truly committed to His plan and purposes for us and we are committed to giving over control to Him, then our survival as His sons and daughters depends on our choosing to entrust our souls, spouses, children, families, homes, careers, possessions, our very lives, to Him." That is surrender, and surrendering is what our risk is all about.
